Proposed Work:

REAR GARDEN: 1 x Ash (T1) - Reduce to 8m and pollard to retain screening of main stem and wildlife habitat

- 1 x Lime (T2) Crown reduce height by up to 5m to provide compact shape, crown reduce spread 2-3m to balance, retain lower epicormic growth for screening by pruning overhang to rear neighbouring property lightly by up to 0.75m lightly to balance whilst retaining some screening growth.
- 1 x Lime (T3) Crown reduce height by up to 5m to provide compact shape, crown reduce spread 2-3m to balance, retain lower epicormic growth for screeningby pruning overhang to rear neighbouring property lightly by up to 0.75m lightly to balance whilst retaining some screening growth.
- 1 x Japanese Maple (T4) Fell to ground level and grind out stump.

Hornbeam Hedge (G1) - Prune height to 5m and prune spread to restore pleached form.

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 08 January 2019 and does not wish to object.
