Thank you for your letter/telephone call of 07 March 2019 giving notice that the above tree(s) are considered dead/dying /dangerous and require emergency works.

The Council confirms that the remedial works as described above are exempt from the need for further notifications or any formal application to the Council and you are therefore allowed to proceed.

Informative(s):

- 1 You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- 2 Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Of particular note is



the protection offered to bats, birds and their nests from construction works. For further information contact Natural England on 0300 060 4911 or www.naturalengland.org.uk.


Conditions and Reasons:

- 1 Prior to the end of the next available planting season following the removal of the tree, 1 no. Aesculus x carnea (red flowering horse chestnut) tree, single stemmed, 12-14cm in girth shall be planted within the rear garden of the property, no less than 1m away from any structure unless otherwise agreed with the council in writing. The tree shall be planted and maintained in line with BS 8545:2014.

Reason: To ensure that the replanting achieves a high quality of landscaping which contributes to the visual amenity and character of the area, in accordance with the requirements of policies A2 and A3 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
