| Class 12 | Advertisements inside buildings |
| Description | 12. An advertisement displayed inside a building, other than an advertisement falling within Class I in Schedule 1. |
| Class 13 | Advertisements on sites used for preceding ten years for display of advertisements without express consent |
| Description | 13. An advertisement displayed on a site that has been used continually for the preceding ten years for the display of advertisements without express consent. |
| Conditions and Limitations | <p>13.—(1) An advertisement does not fall within this description if, during the relevant 10-year period, there has been either a material increase in the extent to which the site has been used for the display of advertisements or a material alteration in the manner in which it has been so used.</p> <p>(2) If any building or structure on which such an advertisement is displayed—</p> <p>(a) is removed in compliance with a requirement of, or under, any enactment,</p> <p>(b) is removed in any other circumstances, or</p> <p>(c) is destroyed by any means,</p> <p>the erection of any building or structure to continue the display is not permitted.</p> <p>(3) Illumination is not permitted unless—</p> <p>(a) the advertisement is displayed with illumination on 6th April 2007; or</p> <p>(b) the advertisement is first displayed after that date, and the advertisement most recently displayed was illuminated.</p> <p>(4) An advertisement that—</p> <p>(a) comprises sequential displays; or</p> <p>(b) otherwise includes moving parts or features; or</p> <p>(c) features intermittent lighting in a manner designed to give the appearance of movement,</p> <p>is not permitted unless—</p> <p>(i) it is displayed on 6th April 2007 and falls within the description specified in any of sub-paragraphs (a) to (c); or</p> <p>(ii) it is first displayed after that date, and the advertisement most recently displayed fell within any such description.</p> |
| Class 14 | Advertisements displayed after expiry of express consent |
| Description | 14. An advertisement displayed after the expiry of express consent, unless— |
| Conditions and Limitations | <p>(a) it would contravene a condition subject to which express consent was granted; or</p> <p>(b) an application for renewal of consent has been refused.</p> <p>14.—(1) The terms of the express consent, including any conditions to which it was subject (to the extent that those terms and conditions are not incapable of performance by reason of the passage of time), shall be treated as applying to the continued display.</p> <p>(2) No advertisement may be displayed under this class except on a site which has been continually used for the purpose since the expiry of the express consent.</p> <p>(3) Unless authorised by the express consent, an advertisement that—</p> <p>(a) comprises sequential displays; or</p> <p>(b) otherwise includes moving parts or features; or</p> <p>(c) features intermittent lighting in a manner designed to give the appearance of movement; or</p> <p>(d) is illuminated,</p> <p>is not permitted.</p> |
| Class 15 | Advertisements on balloons |
| Description | 15. The display of an advertisement on, or consisting of, a balloon not more than 60 metres above ground level. |
| Conditions and Limitations | <p>15.—(1) The site(a) of the advertisement is not in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, a conservation area, a National Park, the Broads or an area of special control.</p> <p>(2) Not more than one advertisement may be displayed on the site at any one time.</p> <p>(3) The site may not be used for the display of advertisements on more than 10 days in total in any calendar year.</p> |
