Dear Emily Whittredge,

We are writing on behalf of the Camden Town Conservation Area Advisory Committee to object strongly to the incongruity and garishness of the painted wall advertisement for the following reasons:

- 1) they harm the settings of (and approaches to) the following heritage assets:-
- The terraces of Listed buildings in the following streets:
- Delancey Street, Mornington Terrace, the Edinboro Public House (Momington Terrace)
- Albert Street. Arlington Road, Mornington Crescent,
- Gloucester Crescent, Regents Park Terrace, Gloucester Gate, Park Village, East Albany Street

Please note that in none of these residential streets is there a single garish advertisement.

- 2) they harm the settings of (and approaches to) the following heritage assets:-
- the Camden Town Conservation Area
- the Primrose Hill Conservation Area
- the Regents Park Conservation Area
- Royal Regents Park

as the case may be, the Secretary of State shall have special regard to the desirability of preserving the building or its setting or any features of special architectural or historic interest which it possesses.

(2)Without prejudice to section 72, in the exercise of the powers of appropriation, disposal and development (including redevelopment) conferred by the provisions of sections 232, 233 and 235(1) of the principal Act, a local authority shall have regard to the desirability of preserving features of special architectural or historic interest, and in particular, listed buildings.

(3)The reference in subsection (2) to a local authority includes a reference to a joint planning board F2. . .

	I object to the use of this wall as an advertising space. It has been unclear to me, a resident of the area for the last 12 years, who owns this car park and why advertisements were permitted. It is clear now that they were never approved. This is a conservation area with many listed houses. A blank canvas like this should be used for a community mural welcoming people to Camden Town and Regents Park, not as free advertising space for estate agents. Our beautful Parkway is already cluttered with too many estate agents as it is. This is not in keeping with the area and is a blatant misuse.	I am responding as Chair of Delancey Street Residents Association and we are completely opposed to the display of advertisements to the boundary wall. It is out of keeping with the conversation area and is an eyesore in Delancey Street. Delancey Street is not a commercial street but a residential street. The council should make sure that our road is maintained in a manner that reflects the historical and residential nature of the area.	I object very strongly to these enormous and inappropriate advertising hoardings erected without planning consent. They adversely affect the character of the pleasant street, in a conservation area and spoil the setting of the listed buildings.
