Tree: Prunus spp (species unknown) T1: Removal of Prunus tree to the front of the property. The tree labelled T1 to the front of the house is in poor health, with large sections of it unlikely to recover.

It is proposed that a replacement tree will be planted within the front garden to compensate for the removal of T1. The location of the replacement tree is proposed to be in approximately the same location, to be of a similar character to the removed T1 and planted as a 2-3 metre multi-stem.

Suggested suitable replacements include (but are not limited to):

Prunus x subhirtella 'Autumnalis Rosea'; Prunus x yedoensis Prunus 'Tai Haku' Prunus incisia 'The Bride' Prunus sargentii
