To whom it may concern:

I am writing to object to planning application 2018/3672/P. It is a wholly unsuitable development which would ruin forever a tranquil haven for nature and people using this part of the unique and irreplaceable haven that is Hampstead Heath. The leafy and tranquil Millfield lane is not a road for regular traffic use and this development would create one, endangering the lives of the many people including young children who regularly use it. The lane is very busy with people accessing the swimming ponds and Kenwood House, especially in the summer months. Bats, birds, insects, and other wildlife, some of it under threat, would be unnecessarily disturbed, threatened and endangered, long lived trees and other flora and fauna would be damaged, noise levels would increase as more recent housing development along this lane has proved, ruining the tranquil, peaceful and leafy nature of this lane. The building of numerous basements as part of this development would damage the fragile underwater stream system this area is known for affecting the neighbouring swimming ponds and nature sanctuaries adjacent to this proposed development. Pollution from traffic emissions, light, noise and heat from the buildings would appear where there is currently none. People go to this part of London to escape noise, traffic, urbanisation and to recharge themselves by the unique natural beauty of Millfield Lane and the surrounding ponds and Hampstead Heath. This development would rob thousands of people of the unique, necessary and natural environment at the drives of and on Hampstead Heath and benefiting 5 families. This proposed development is unacceptable and must be rejected.
