### London's historic gay pub The Black Cap in Camden closed by owners a week after being awarded 'asset of community value' status

The Black Cap, one of London's best known LGBTQ pubs and drag venues, has been closed by its owners just one week after Camden Council awarded it the "asset of community value" (ACV) status.

The pub, which has been open as a gay venue since the 1960s, was closed for the last time by owners Faucett Inn on Sunday night, the latest in a string of alternative and LGBTQ venues that have been closed down across the capital, from Madame Jojo's in Soho to The Joiner's Arms in Hackney.

The self-declared "Home of RuPaul's Drag Race in the UK," The Black Cap's ACV status was awarded in recognition of it "furthering [of] the social well-being or cultural, recreational or sporting interests of the local community," according to Camden Council.

The owners have reportedly tried and failed to gain permission from the council to redevelop the area above the venue three times since 2011.

The latest of these attempts was made in February, when requests to have the first, second and third floor above the venue turned into flats, which was refused, the *Camden New Journal* reports.

The future of the venue has yet to be revealed, Faucett Inn said it closed the historic pub as the sale of the venue's freehold "will complete imminently".

The ACV status is meant to give venues an added layer of protection from becoming sold and redeveloped.

If the landowner wishes to sell a property with this status, the council must be informed, and if a group wants to buy the asset, they can trigger a six month buffer period to attempt to raise the money for the site, though the owner is still within their rights to sell the property at the market rate.

# Iconic Camden pub The Black Cap has suddenly closed down

It's been a particularly sad time for pubs of late. First developers bulldozed the <u>Carlton Tavern in Kilburn</u> without telling the landlady and now <u>The Black Cap</u> on Camden High Street has suddenly closed down. The long-standing LGBTQ pub has been open since the mid 1960s with the motto 'Just Be Fabulous', but sadly neither its long history or sassy motto was enough to save the bar from closing. Faucet Inn, the company that owns the pub, decided to shut down the bar last night without giving anyone much warning. But the beginning of the end started in January

when Camden Council proposed to turn the first, second and third floors of the pub's building into flats. A mass of the pub's supporters sent letters of objection and the proposal was overturned in February. The venue was also awarded Asset of Community Value status from Camden Council last month, which you'd think would count against closing it down, but apparently not. Since the pub's closure last night, the venue's website and Twitter page have been shut down, and The Black Cap has been removed from Faucet Inn's listing pages.

With the recent closures of other prominent LGBTQ London venues, the Joiners Arms and the Nelson's Head, and the Royal Vauxhall Tavern under threat, this is starting to become a worrying trend and we don't like it one bit.

# Sale of Iconic Black Cap in Camden to Imbiba Partnership's Ruth & Robinson

Acting for Faucet Inn, leisure property specialists, Davis Coffer Lyons, has secured the sale of The Black Cap in Camden to Ruth & Robinson, the Imbiba-backed project inspired by the bars of Brooklyn.

The rent for the property is £300,000 per annum, held on the remainder of a 25 year lease. The iconic public house is located on a prime commercial pitch on Camden High Street near the intersection with Parkway, and incorporates a substantial trade space with a 3am licence on Friday and Saturday. Dating back to the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the premises are set over four storeys with a rear roof terrace. The total floor area constitutes over 7,500 sq ft of space.

Since the closure of the well-known LGBT venue last year, Ruth & Robinson has since submitted a planning proposal to the local council to "create a unique, distinctive and vibrant drinking establishment which is welcoming to the whole community". The new set-up would see bar areas on the ground and first floors, with function rooms on the second floor. A kitchen would be in the basement.

# Calls to reopen iconic Black Cap pub as links to Russian billionaires' offshore cash revealed

An offshore company ultimately owned by two Russian billionaire steel magnates invested in one of London's most iconic gay pubs – that is facing an uncertain future.

Documents reveal the company owned by industrial titans Alexander Abramov and Alexander Frolov - joint heads of Russia's largest steel producer Evraz - lent money to The Black Cap pub in Camden Town in 2013.

The pub was bought by an offshore Jersey-based company in 2010. Its doors closed in 2015.

The offshore financing deal was made public by campaign group Transparency International (TI) this week.

It has led loyal regulars to renew their calls for The Black Cap to be re-opened as a dedicated lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) venue.

Ben Walters, of campaign group the Black Cap Foundation, said: "Knowing the details of deals like this exposes the colossal gulf between the people who love and use our historic community spaces and the wealthy people who decide their fate.

"That's why we desperately need more protection for pubs, queer venues and all spaces that care about people, community and culture."

Last year a *Ham&High* investigation revealed six of seven local pubs bought by offshore companies between 2010 and 2014 have since been closed down. The Black Cap was one.

Black Cap campaigner Nigel Harris said at the time that communication over the future of threatened pubs was almost impossible because of the anonymity surrounding offshore ownership.

TI were first alerted to the case of The Black Cap by the *Ham&High's* reports and delved deeper into its financing after the Black Cap Foundation provided further information and documents.

Land Registry deeds show a British Virgin Islands (BVI) company called Vollin Holdings Limited took a mortgage in The Black Cap in October 2013.

Other documents released in the US show Vollin is wholly owned by another BVI company, Whiteclif Enterprises Ltd, whose ultimate owners are the Russian billionaires Mr Abramov and Mr Frolov.

The super-rich industrialists feature on the Forbes' list of World Billionaires with combined fortunes of \$6.1billion, and Mr Abramov is a close business associate of Chelsea FC owner Roman Abramovich.

A letter from Vollin Holdings' lawyers, Norton Rose Fulbright, reveals Vollin's mortgage in The Black Cap was released in January 2016, meaning the Russians no longer have an interest in the property.

The Black Cap and two other pubs were bought by Jersey-based company Kicking Horse Ltd in 2010 in a £13.3million deal.

In March 2013 and March 2015 planning applications by Steve Cox, of the pub company Faucet Inn Ltd, to turn the upstairs floors of The Black Cap into flats were refused following heated opposition.

The pub was shut down in April 2015 and has remained closed ever since.

The decision has caused high levels of stress to the local LGBT community who hold vigils at The Black Cap regularly on Saturdays and have demanded it is re-opened as a dedicated LGBT venue.


Mr Cox, of Faucet Inn Ltd, did not comment when contacted by the *Ham&High*.

### There are plans to re-open iconic LGBT pub The Black Cap

It's one of Camden's most famous pubs, but <u>iconic boozer The Black Cap has been closed for two years</u>. After pub group Faucet Inn had plans to turn its upper floors into flats rejected by Camden council in 2015, the pub closed its doors.

But according to the <u>Camden New Journal</u>, an unnamed theatre company is believed to be planning a tenancy deal to re-open the boozer and keep it as an LGBT venue.

When the pub closed in 2015, locals set up the We Are Black Cap campaign to lobby the owners. Eastenders actress Michelle Collins is a member of the group. She said: 'It would be a terrible shame if it wasn't to reopen. It is a truly iconic place, part of the very fabric of the area, a crucial venue.'

The Black Cap owner Steve Cox, of Faucet Inn, said he is waiting for the council to determine what type of use the building has. He added: 'We are still waiting for determination on this. We are trying to work with the council and We Are Black Cap. We want the business to open again in a form that works for all parties. As long as it remains closed it is a stain on the high street for everyone. We'd look at all and any proposals.'

There were plans to turn the building into another outlet of The Breakfast Club, as well as a bar called Hollenbeck's, but both proposals came to nothing. Let's hope The Black Cap can live up to its motto and 'Just be Fabulous' again soon.

### Protest to mark three year anniversary of Black Cap pub closure

Campaigners vow to see famous gay pub re-opened, as owner says firm is waiting for right deal

### How the Black Cap looks after being unused since 2015

WE will never surrender!

This is the defiant cry by campaigners who this weekend will mark the third anniversary of the closure of Camden Town's world-famous gay pub, The Black Cap.

The Black Cap Foundation want owners Kicking Horse to re-open the venue as it was and will protest outside the pub on Saturday. They say the investment firm has had long enough to find new operators, but are asking for an unrealistic price. The campaigners say at least 25 potential operators have looked at the building, which remains unused.

Kicking Horse director Steve Cox said it was still on the market and they were waiting for the right offer. The firm bought the pub from Faucet Inn.

Foundation spokesman Alex Green told the New Journal: "Its continued closure is nothing but a massive insult to the area, and the LGBT community in particular. This is a disgrace that such a wonderful, historic building is being left to decay."


He added: "We say we are winning. The pub may not be open yet, but it is still there, it isn't a coffee shop or restaurant, they have not built flats. It may be closed but it is still the Black Cap, and we are not going to go away." The protests, pickets and petitions have garnered the support of the Greater London Authority, Camden Council, the Campaign for Real Ale and civic groups. Mr Cox met the Foundation for talks in January 2017.

Mr Green said: "We had six meetings and put a case forward. We felt it was productive, but then it did not go anywhere. He [Mr Cox] says no one wants it, but we say, for how much?" Mr Green added: "We had groups who expressed serious interest and asked for information regarding surveys and leases, but got nowhere. Kicking Horse asked for £300,000 a year on the lease. It means they are simply not listening to what the market is saying. We say it could be opened by now by its owners, without the need for to it be sold, or it should be offered at a realistic price."


Mr Cox said yesterday (Wednesday) he is continuing to seek a resolution. He added: "It is frustrating for all parties. We would dearly like to have it open. We have conducted a marketing exercise to find the right tenant. That is still ongoing but we still have not found someone to satisfy both parties."

He said the Black Cap was being marketed as a pub with a cabaret venue, "as it was in its heyday." Mr Cox added that the economic weather was not in their favour.

He said: "This time five years ago, we had a lot more pubs. There have been so many headwinds in this industry against us. It is a tough climate. We would love to see some kind of conclusion, but it's got to be right for all parties."




