- 3 Reasons for granting permission (delegated):

This application is for the installation of three stone name plaques on the three

central bays on the Gower Street elevation of the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. The plaques are to celebrate women scientists who as yet remain un commemorated. The size, weight and typeface of the new names, will be to match the existing names already displayed on the elevations of the grade II listed building which form an important part of the decorative design of this handsome 1929 façade.

The existing stone plaques are integral to the Portland stone elevation and are sculpted in the blocks embedded into the stone of the façade. The new carved stone plaques are to be fixed to the face of the dressed stone above the three central windows on Gower Street at second floor level and will appear to match the existing commemorative names.

The introduction of the commemorative plaques will positively contribute to the significance of this listed building, both historically and architecturally. The scheme is therefore supported.

No responses were received as a result of the public consultation by means of a Press Notice or Site Notice. The site's planning history has been taken into account when making this decision.

Special regard has been attached to the desirability of preserving the listed building and its features of special architectural or historic interest, under s.16 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies D1 and D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the London Plan 2016 and the National Planning Policy Framework.

This proposal may be liable for the Mayor of London's Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) and the Camden CIL. Both CILs are collected by Camden Council after a liable scheme has started, and could be subject to surcharges for failure to assume liability or submit a commencement notice PRIOR to commencement. We issue formal CIL liability notices setting out how much you may have to pay once a liable party has been established. CIL payments will be subject to indexation in line with construction costs index.
