Proposal: Installation of an Automated Teller Machine (ATM) to Coram Street elevation.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reasons:

Reasons for Refusal

- The proposed Automatic Teller Machine and associated alterations to the shopfront, by virtue of its design, would be an unsympathetic feature in the shopfront which would be detrimental to the character and appearance of the host building and the Conservation Area, contrary to policies A1 (Managing the Impact on Development), D1 (Design), D2 (Heritage) and D3 (Shopfronts) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.
- The proposed Automatic Teller Machine, by virtue of its location, would contribute to opportunities for crime, fear of crime and anti-social behaviour, contrary to policy C5 (Safety and security) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.
