DECISION

Town and Country Planning Acts 1990 (as amended) Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation Order) Regulations 1999

PART APPROVAL / REFUSAL OF WORKS TO TREE/S UNDER A TREE PRESERVATION ORDER

Address: Beechwood House 43 Hampstead Lane London N6 4RU

Proposal: IN GROUNDS: 1 x Common Holly (T1) - Reduce crown by 1.2 - 1.8m. 1 x Common Cherry (T2) - Fell to ground level. 1 x Common Cherry (T3) - Fell to ground level. 1 x Common Oak (T4) - Reduce crown back to new growth points. 1 x Common Oak (T5) - Fell to ground level. 1 x Common Oak (T6) - Fell to ground level.

The Council has considered your application dated 03 April 2019 and decided the following:

a) to REFUSE :

1 x Common Oak (T5) - Fell to ground level.

Reasons for Refusal



1 T5, a veteran oak tree is proposed for removal. The tree has been heavily reduced historically and is considered to be of great ecological significance. The justification for removing the tree is the presence of basal decay, however an assessment of the extent of the decay has not been submitted with the application. The tree is in a low target area with little activity around the tree. Some degree of basal decay is not uncommon on oak trees of this age, the presence of unquantified decay is not considered robust enough justification to remove the tree.

b) to GRANT APPROVAL for:

IN GROUNDS: 1 x Common Holly (T1) - Reduce crown by 1.2 - 1.8m.
1 x Common Cherry (T2) - Fell to ground level.
1 x Common Cherry (T3) - Fell to ground level.
1 x Common Oak (T4) - Reduce crown back to new growth points.
1 x Common Oak (T6) - Fell to ground level.

Conditions and Reasons:

1 This decision is valid for 2 years from the date of this decision or until the work is completed, which ever is the sooner.

Reason: To allow the Local planning authority to monitor the completion and standards of the work.

2 All work shall be carried out in accordance with the relevant recommendations of British Standard 3998: 2010. (Recommendation for Tree Work)

Reason: To ensure the preservation of the amenity value and health of the tree(s).

3 Prior to the end of the next available planting season (November 2019- March 2020) following the completion of works, 3 trees, 16-18cm in circumference at 1m in height shall be planted of a species and in locations to be agreed with the council in writing and no less 1m away from any structure. The trees shall be planted and maintained in line with BS8545:2014.

Reason: To ensure that the replanting achieves a high quality of landscaping which contributes to the visual amenity and character of the area

1 Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife.
