Hope you are having a fantastic bank holiday weekend.

I am a resident of 26 Netherhall Gardens, and I'm writing to oppose the proposal for development on this property.

I disagree with the removal of the trees and green spaces around the area. Currently, there are many large, established trees in the front and rear of the property, along with being beneficial to the environment and mood of residents, give this neighbourhood and surrounding area the iconic Fitzjohns Avenue look.

The double-storey basement that is considered to be built will extend into the back garden, further removing what little garden space there is for a resident in London. Due to the property being on a slope, it's unclear what detrimental effects there could be to water drainage and general structural stability.

The entire street is visually consistent in architectural design, with the exception of a couple of few considered buildings that contribute, for example, South Hampstead High School. While the potential construction will already be a nuisance for neighbours, the new design of this property will be much larger, sticking out from the rest of the street. The building is already rather large, and any extensions will be too much for the area.

I'm somewhat concerned that agreeing with this application on this property will set a runaway effect, where multiple other buildings in this neighbourhood will put forward planning applications - something that shouldn't happen to preserve the aesthetic in this Conservation Area.
