Barrow Hill Reservoir, St. Edmunds Terrace,
Proposed foreman's office & store.

Adverting to my representative's interview with your Mr. Davidson, I enclose herewith specification and two copies of plan No. 5/46/A relating to the construction of a new foreman's office and store at the above reservoir.

The Board have decided, following serious war damage, to convert the residence and office, denoted on the 32 feet to 1 inch block plan as "Residence" on the above drawing, into two flats, in order to provide further accommodation for a servant of the Board whose duties require him to be housed in the close vicinity of the reservoir. It is essential, therefore to remove the foreman's office, at present occupying part of the ground floor, to new premises in the immediate locality. The plans submitted show the position selected by the Board's Chief Engineer for the erection of the proposed office, the foundations of which have already been laid, the necessary licences having been granted by the local authority and sanction obtained from the appropriate department of the Ministry of Health.

The area upon which the new building is to be constructed was previously utilized for the storage of pipes and sundry equipment. It will be noted therefore, that the appearance of the frontage to St. Edmunds Terrace will thereby be greatly improved by the proposed structure, the frontage line being set behind the building line as far as is compatible with the position of the toe of the reservoir bank.

To comply with the Town and Country Planning Acts and to avoid cessation of the work in progress, I shall be obliged if you will have the proposals and action taken as set out above, confirmed and sanctioned as soon as possible.
