2019/2491/L		14/06/2019 13:40:19	OBJ	<p>I should like to object to the conversion of the old Hampstead Police Station into a school.</p> <p>My objection is to the pavement, parking and road congestion that this school will create.</p> <p>As can be seen in Fitzjohns Avenue, the majority of children are dropped off by their parents by car. And the majority of parents insist on dropping kids as close to the entrance as possible. The congestion that this additional traffic will worsen an already congested area. There are only three approach roads: Hampstead High Street, Rosslyn Hill and Downshire Hill.</p> <p>The lower half of Downshire hill is so narrow that it is virtually a one-way street. The additional traffic created by a new school at the top will result in impossible congestion for residents.</p> <p>Similarly, Hampstead High Street is congested almost all day, particularly due to the narrowness of the lower half. It is already very difficult for buses or any large vehicle to negotiate their way through with stopping and waiting for someone else to open a gap. Again, increased traffic due to the school will worsen an already bad situation.</p> <p>Access from Rosslyn Hill, on the other hand, is generally clear.</p> <p>However, whichever way that the cars approach, there is nowhere for them to stop and drop kids. The only solution would be to double park either on Downshire Hill or on Rosslyn Hill. They are both wide roads within 100 metres of the school but there are never any available parking spaces so they would all have to double-park. The experience of Fitzjohn's Avenue in the morning and afternoon should convince the Camden of the folly of allowing that to occur in central Hampstead.</p> <p>Thank you Roger Hayhurst</p>

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
