The existing unit was illegally used to display large adverts designed to catch the eye of motorists and pedestrians approaching from the north. This is expressly forbidden within the Bloomsbury Conservation Area, with other telecoms providers complying with the regulation. All my recent conversations with other telecoms providers have led me to conclude that the provision of old tech telephones on streets is now redundant. There are also crime related concerns which have yet to be resolved, stemming from the misuse of other kiosks in East London boroughs. The existing kiosk should be removed and not replaced with the proposed unit.
