Trees along the boundary of 82a & School:			
T1: Cherry: Fell to ground level. Reason: Near to the b boundary of neighbouring school and close to the building in 82a. It is Ivy clad and has recently died.			
T2: Mimosa: Reduce crown by 40%. Remove broken branches and limbs. Reason: Has several large broken out limbs hanging in the crown. The branch structure is over extended and is prone to more breakage.			
T3: Mimosa: Reduce crown by 30-40%. Remove dead wood and broken branches. Reason: The tree is touching the school roof and has a similar crown structure to T2.			
T4: Mimosa (largest in the group): Reduce crown by approximately 30%. Raise crown by removing lower limb overhanging Shepherds Walk. Remove dea wood. Thin crown density by 25%. Reason: General maintenance			
T5: Mimosa: Reduce crown by 30-40%. Reason: General maintenance.			
T6: Mimosa: Fell to ground level. Reason: It has a large longitudinal split in the lower section of the main stem.			
T4, T5 & T6 - are located along the boundary and overhanging Shepherds Walk public footway. All three have significant and acute leans. They are subject to large weight burden and overhang the public footway and gardens of neighbouring property.			
T7: Large Poplar: Reduce main stem back to live wood. Pollard the live limb. Reason: The main stem of the tree is Ivy clad and dead at above approximately 7.00-8.00m.			
T8: Sycamore: Remove dead wood and broken branches. Reason: General maintenance.
