Hi Stuart,

We've heard back from the planning officer at Camden and have a little more information to provide before we can start the works, including:

- Q22a and Q 25a. A temporary site access is to be created on the Outer Circle, approximately 40 meters south of the junction with Gloucester Gate. This will require a temporary vehicle crossover to be constructed in the footway. It is assumed that these highway works will be undertaken by the Crown Estates Pavement Commission. **We will need to see a copy of the design drawing and evidence of approval of the Crown Estates Pavement Commission.**

They also require that the footway is closed for significantly less than three minutes and have suggested one minute at a time, which is a good thing I think.

We can specify the approach to protecting the footway as we discussed on site, namely by use of a timber in front of the curb and a mat over the footway to be laid when in use and removed when not in use; would you be happy to confirm by response to this email that this principle will meet your requirement for a licence to cross over the footway? That would be very helpful.

If you could also attach the application form for the licence to cross over I'd be grateful.
