				The old kiosk was installed in full knowledge that the already-obsolete telephony it contained would not be much used, which was the case. The primary function of the kiosk was to be used as an advertising hoarding in public space.
				 We are happy that the proposed kiosk will occupy a much smaller footprint. WE DO NOT OBJECT TO ITS DECLARED USE AS A TELEPHONE KIOSK (but see 3 below). We continue strongly to object to the use of this structure for advertising. Specifically, we object very strongly to the placement of an advertising hoarding 20 feet from our front windows in public space. NO ADVERTISING SHOULD BE PERMITTED. Before any permit is granted, we ask that the installer assure Council in writing that no acoustically intrusive incoming-call device will be installed. (The kiosk directly across the High Street came complete with incoming telephone facilities whose ring penetrated our triple glazing day and night. Our requests for silencing were ignored.) NO ACOUSTICALLY PENETRATING INCOMING TELEPHONE FACILITY should be permitted.
