I object to the development on the following grounds: The proposed development is on woodland/ garden/ back-land which is against Camden policy. The applicant has failed to provide information on how building materials and equipment would be transported to the site considering the narrow passage on the side of the building. The applicant has failed to provide information of how he proposes the introduction of utilities to the site. Although the application states it is car-free, there are two car parking areas shown in one of the planning documents, and so it seems, if granted, the proposal would increase traffic in the already extremely busy lower part of Frognal. The site has been nominated as a Local Green Space by the Redington Frognal Neighbourhood Forum under Policy BGI 5 Local Green Spaces in accordance with the provisions of para 77 of the National Planning Policy Framework. This site provides filtering from the highly polluted Finchley Road. Unfortunately, the owner has already cut down/ reduced several trees. To date he has failed to replant the felled tree, as required, missing the deadline of end March. The planning application indicates that further trees would be removed, and the viability of those remaining would be more doubtful if the land is developed (root zones etc). It is difficult to see how such overdevelopment of this already congested and high density part of Frognal would ¿improve the character and quality of an area and the way it functions (NPPF D1n)¿; or how it would not have a detrimental ¿ impact upon the amenity and character of an area (NPPF D1 7.20)¿.
