They have given permission for a building (13a Pond Street which completely alters the ambiance of rear gardens towards the Pond Street end. They have permitted the overdevelopment of the site at 25 HHG, where one ugly house has been replaced by an even uglier one of massive proportions. This building shows no sensitivity to the Victorian buildings around it and visually at least appears to have no architectural merit.  The plans for the new house at 4B HHG involve the demolition of an admittedly undistinguished building and the construction of a much larger, taller one of incongruous modern design.  I am opposed to this planning application for the following reasons.  It is an overdevelopment of the site  The style of the building is out of keeping with surrounding houses  The additional floor will affect light and sun in nearby gardens  The basement excavation will have a negative effect on the adjoining house
