If the inclusion of a sump pit is so important to the plans for the extension of the pub, I cannot understand why it was not included in the original application. Was this simply inefficiency or an afterthought to boost the profits of the developers? And that it should be proposed right next door to the living space of the neighbours, without any safeguards against possible leakage and damage, further indicates the developers' disdain of local people's concerns. Finally the fact that the neighbours' attention to this recent application came not as a result of direct communications from the planners but because another member of the local community had the foresight to forward it to them is in itself evidence of the developers' self-interest at the cost of local people's welfare.</p> <p>The Council's initial permission to the Bull & Last to develop caused considerable misgivings in the local community, and the ongoing construction work has caused a lot of disruption to regular passersby, due to the noise and reduction of pedestrian space at the end of Woodsome Road. It would be shameful if the Council were to make things even worse by approving this most recent application. I shall be writing to our local councillors to encourage them to register their objection.</p>
