Gentlemen,

Town and Country Planning Acts, 1932 and 1944.
Town and Country Planning (General Interim
Development) Order, 1946.

Consideration has been given to your application of 27th April, 1948, for permission to use the site shown red on the plan (No. 1077) submitted, for the erection of temporary store buildings in connection with the adjoining plaster works at 24, Albert Street, St. Pancras.

With reference thereto, I am directed to inform you that the Council, in pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Order, hereby refuses permission in respect of the application for the reasons that the site is within an area tentatively zoned as residential and the proposed use would not conform with this zoning and is likely to affect adversely the amenities of the surrounding residential development.

Your attention is invited to the last paragraph of the Council's letter dated 8th August, 1947.
