The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

- The proposed first floor extension, by reason of its height, bulk and design, would be an incongruous and obtrusive addition which would harm the architectural integrity of the existing building and the character and appearance of the surrounding area, contrary to policy D1 (Design) of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Policy 2 (Design and Character) of the Fortune Green and West Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan 2015.
- The proposed first floor extension, by reason of the proximity of its rear habitable room window, would result in the loss of privacy to the neighbouring property at no 11 Dynham Road, contrary to policy A1 (Managing the impact of development) of

the Camden Local Plan 2017.
