Land at Branch Hill Corner of Branch Hill/West Heath Road Hampstead Heath London
Excavation of a natural wildlife pond with a grass slipway. The pond will be fenced with planting between two rows of fencing. Consent for a natural-looking information board on the pavement nearby is also sought.

Recommend No Archaeological Requirement

Further to my letter of 19th July, I have now received further information on the extent of 19th century quarries and visited the site to inspect the local topography. I am now satisfied beyond reasonable doubt that the proposed pond will lie in an area of 19th century quarry infill and former pond.

I therefore conclude that the proposal is very unlikely to have a significant effect on heritage assets of archaeological interest.

No further assessment or conditions are therefore necessary.




