## **DECISION**

NO OBJECTION TO SECTION 211 NOTICE OF WORKS TO TREE/S IN A
CONSERVATION AREA

DD 5 Day Notice TPO FRONT GARDEN: 1 x Beech (T1) - Fell to ground level.

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 26 July 2019 and does not wish to object.

## Informative(s):

- 1 This notice is valid for 2 years from the date of this letter or until the work is completed, which ever is the sooner.
- You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- 3 Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as



- amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Of particular note is the protection offered to bats, birds and their nests from construction works. For further information contact Natural England on 0300 060 4911 or www.naturalengland.org.uk.
- Where the removal of dead/dangerous tree(s) has taken place the owner has a 4 duty under Section 213 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) to plant a replacement tree. In this case the Council recommends that a copper beech tree (Fagus sylvatica purpurea) be planted as a heavy standard with a girth size of 14-16cms in the front garden of property. The planting process should take into account the standards set out in BS8545:2014. The tree should be suitably staked and tied. The replacement should be planted by the end of the next planting season between the start of November 2019 and the end of March 2020. Failure to plant an appropriate replacement tree may result in the Council serving a Tree Replacement Notice.
