Dear Sir/Madam,

[REDACTED] I have received a letter concerning the intended works to a Eucalyptus tree [REDACTED]. The intention is to fell the tree as there is possible subsidence in a Rotunda.

From the information I have been given it seems that the tree may not be the contributing factor to the buildings subsidence. The tree is not planted on clay as it sits on around 8 feet of infill which was used to level the garden and the Rotunda must be sitting on infill itself to make it level.

I strongly object to the tree being felled. We are overlooked by two blocks of flats (one of which was erected two years ago and is significantly higher than the previous building) and the tree acts as a means to keep our property private.

It is also a beautiful tree that is admired by ourselves and our neighbours from all sides. I have received letters and had conversations from neighbours to support this claim.

It would be devastating for my family, myself, my neighbours and for the conservation of the area if this tree was felled to ground level. I look forward to your thoughts and hoping that you reverse this decision.
