There¿s catwalk lighting, wooden high-top tables, cosy booths and an authentic London Routemaster Bus. Sample ice-cold local beers or signature cocktails and graze on tasty bar snacks. Happy Hour everyday from 17:00 to 19:00; OPENING HOURS: 8am-3pm.'</p> <p>This latter is, of course, a typo for 8am - 3am.</p> <p>He rightly indicates that the Generator has now gone back to marketing itself as a 24/7 fun venue. This is quite unreasonable for residents, particularly in view of the current management's inability to satisfactorily control noise nuisance as it is. The prospect of a coffee shop is yet another attempt by the Generator to cynically steam-roller its presence on the neighbourhood to the detriment of nearby residents - particularly those at Knollys House.</p> <p>The Knollys House Residents' Association objects.</p> |
