## To whom it may concern

As a resident owner in Conway Street, I object to the above application for the following reasons:

I visited the public consultation at 36-38 Fitzroy Square in July 2019.

1. The nominated applicant, NCH, was presented as a small institution of 200 students, wanting to move from Bedford Square.

No mention was made that Northeastern University was to be the umbrella applicant and sending a large number of its own students to Fitzroy Square.

- 2. A. The Square remains largely residential with only some buildings housing offices, working Monday-Friday only; the proposal for Northeastern is to be open 7days/week to 22:00 for some 1200 students: this is a vast increase in the population for both the Square and exit and surrounding streets and goes against the Council's desire NOT to lose office space and
- B. is not part of the Fitzrovia Action Plan.
- 3. The costly and recent pedestrianisation of the Square has resulted in a well-visited and self-regulated area of calm as a part of the surrounding Conservation Area, in addition to the grade 1 listing of the facade of 36-38 Fitzroy Square.
- 4. A mass of young people will swamp the area, creating noise and, no doubt, litter, the clearing up of which is paid for through MY council tax.
- 5. There are insufficient facilities for the parking of innumerable bicycles nor for the (almost 900 sqm) of outdoor space, as required for a facility of this size.
- 6. 'Education/Office space' seems a dubious description of an education facility with administration support.
- 7. Northeastern, offering private education, is NOT a community facility and there have been no signs of any 'public benefit' to date, as promised by the Bedford Square campus.
