Assessment
The vegetation in Harpur Mews collectively creates a pleasant green space within the gardens and
provides screening for the properties from the delivery area of Lacon House. The reasons for removal
would not be considered sufficient to justify removal where trees are worthy of being brought under
the protection of a TPO. However the trees are not visible from the public realm. They are not
particularly large or noteworthy examples of their species or of any known cultural or historic
importance. The pyracantha and the holm oak are both growing in positions which are not considered
sustainable and in the case of the holm oak will prevent it from reaching its full potential and therefore
becoming a large and noteworthy tree. It is not considered that it would be expedient to bring these
trees under the protection of a TPO.
The works to the whitehear are considered to be acceptable management of this tree
The works to the whitebeam are considered to be acceptable management of this tree.
