I have a low parameter boundary to my property and unfortunately, my house was broken into in July 2018 and the forced entry led to both my cars being stolen. This was a traumatic experience to me and my young family and I can therefore relate to Mr and Mrs Hirschfield (as the owners of 52 Redington Road) with regard to their desire to increase the boundary parameter for their own security reasons.

I have seen the proposed planning application (ref 2019/5221/P) submitted by Mr and Mrs Hirschfield in relation to the front boundary treatment for their renovated house and believe it is in total keeping with the street scene and aspect of the house considering its set back from the road and large carriage driveway nature.
