I have spoken with the Camden Police Licensing Team who are fully aware of the proposal and have attended the venue to complete a site visit and meet with the applicants. I have been informed that they have no objections to the proposal but they will be making recommendations on the premises licence that will address the management of the people when either inside the venue or when they are leaving. As this is a unique use of the existing building then then management strategy will be most important factor for the running of the venue.
