Why did this not occur?  ¿ Also there are no planning notices on Eton Avenue where houses and a primary school are affected Regarding the actual application:  The Tower is part of an important Grade 2* listed building, a well known historic example of a fire station in London  Designing different areas within the floors (and adding covers that can be lifted) to demarcate the "void" do not make up for the transformation of the original structure.  Scrutinising the plans, it is clear that the attempt to maintain the integrity of the original design has resulted in a conversion with very little merit. The floor areas are simply too small, with the plan demonstrating the poor aesthetics and limited space options $\dot{c}$ i.e not suitable for a one bedroom flat.
