Reason for granting listed building consent: 26 Grove Terrace is a Grade II* listed yellow stock and brown brick terrace, built in 1780 and forming part of a terrace of 22 houses situated in the Dartmouth Park Conservation area. This conservation area has a variety and complexity that charts the history of domestic architecture from the late 18th Century to the present day.

Listed building consent was granted in 2019 for partial demolition and re-build of the north garden wall under application ref 2019/2548/L. Following collapse of the boundary wall to the Grove Terrace Mews access road at number 21 Grove Terrace, it is now proposed to add three 440 x 105mm buttresses with chamfered tops, equally spaced, to the section of the wall adjacent to the house. Stone copings will be retained. The works are justified and necessary and a detailed statement has been submitted specifying a heritage approach to the works, including the use of lime mortar and an appropriate pointing finish.

The proposed works will not harm the special interest of the Grade II* listed structure.

The application has been advertised in the press and by means of a site notice, whereby no consultation responses were received. Historic England were consulted and authorised the local authority to determine the application as we see fit. The authorisation letter has been stamped by the NPCU. The Dartmouth Park Conservation Area Advisory Committee were consulted and raised no objections.

The site's planning history has been taken into account in making this decision.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving the special interest of the listed building, under s.16 of the Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policy D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the London Plan 2016 and the NPPF.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.
