St Paul's Mews is part of the important Camden Square conservation area and these buildings have survived in reasonably intact condition although unfortunately some windows have been changed at the rear of this building. The proposed roof extension would dramatically change and destroy the character of the traditional original sweep of neighbouring sloped slate roofs and could set a terrible precedent. The proposal would resemble a bland city office block. This planned installation is not appropriate for this traditional Camden building. It would be a disaster to demolish part of the original surviving roof. The proposed windows are extremely inappropriate and do not fit in with this historic mews. Rooflights on the front roofslope would not be appropriate and would cause a nuisance. There is already mass development and a huge amount of newly built housing nearby and this attempt to increase and intensely concentrate the occupation of this building would cause further tension and issues with overcrowding, waste, noise and nuisance to neighbours and overuse and pressure on council services. There are already major problems with waste, noise and pressures on Camden Council in this area.
