No details are supplied as to the proximity and degree of risk to the neighbouring properties. Without this we only hear the trees are healthy and some are saplings. No mention is given to old vs. new positions for comparison except a single line comment. The ability to transplant healthy trees is not addressed. I would suggest more detail is needed on the what, why and where to the application. Otherwise a carefully planned, mix tree planting is scrapped without a rationale.
