## **DECISION**

Town and Country Planning Act 1990

### **Advertisement Consent Granted**

Address:

**124 Southampton Row  
London  
WC1B 5AA**

Proposal:

Display of internally illuminated fascia lettering/logo and projecting box signs to shopfront at ground floor level (retrospective).

Drawing Nos: Site location plan; (517/SD/-)01, 02, 03; Email from New Image Design dated 12/11/2019.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions and Reasons:

- 1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to
  - (a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);

- (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or aid to navigation by water or air; or
- (c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 5 Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

#### Informative(s):

- 1 Reason for granting advertisement consent:

The proposed signage (which is already displayed) is considered to be acceptable within the context of this busy commercial high street environment in terms of its' size, design, location, methods of illumination and luminance levels, and does not have any adverse impact on neighbouring amenity, nor is it harmful to pedestrians or vehicular safety in accordance with Camden Planning Guidance.

While internally illuminated signs would not normally be acceptable within a conservation area, in this particular instance, the internally illuminated signage is modestly sized with suitably low luminance levels (no higher than 250 cd/m<sup>2</sup>) and with only the lettering/logo's illuminated (the backgrounds remaining non-illuminated). Furthermore, the proposed signage does not obscure or damage any significant architectural features, nor detract from the character and appearance of the Bloomsbury Conservation Area.

The site's planning and appeals history has been taken into account when coming to this decision. No objections have been received following statutory consultation.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies A1, D1, D2 and D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017, the London Plan 2016, and the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.
