Re: Objections to Planning Application Reference No. 2019/4921/P Proposed
balustrade to new fenestration arrangement

First I am choked to discover that there has been approval of new fenestration arrangements that creates a first floor terrace looking directly into the Haverstock Hill 150a bedroom and study windows, my outside space (and the terrace and directly into the bedroom of 150 Haverstock Hill). There has been no notification of this alteration to any of the properties that are affected.

As usual the owners of Upper Park road 2 are doing things behind our backs that will very badly affect the quality of our lives. The psychological stress they have created to us all over the past 3 years is enormous. We never know what they are doing next that will hurt us.

As I work from home, the fact that people can look literally look onto my desk - with very confidential information - is already disturbing.

The fact that there can be noisy parties right under my bedroom window is even more disturbing. Why do they need a terrace on the first floor when they have a garden. The houses next to them do not. Neither can they look into each other's window.

Their terrace will come up to just 1 meter from my windows.

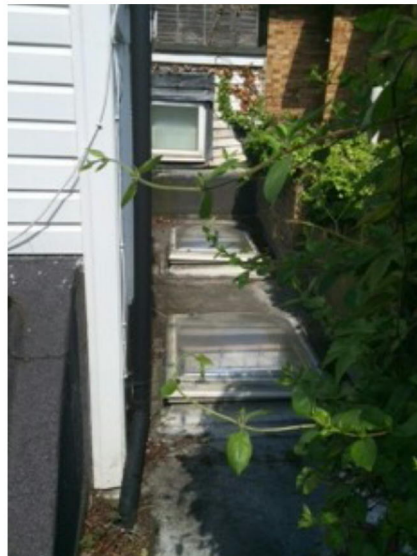
Furthermore, there is only a foot high wall between my flat roof and terrace and their first floor roof height. See photo below:



This is unacceptable. If they put up a barrier, like the one to the right from Haverstock Hill 150, they will cut out all the remaining light to my living room and workroom. The reason they were refused to build up to this party wall in the first place. The second floor of 150 Haverstock Hill has severely restricted my light.

Below can be seen just how close the wall is to my study window.

Below can also be seen the placement of the skylight giving the only light to my living room now. – just around the corner in the picture below. Where the green bush is to the left of the gutter pipe is where the brown barrier to 150 Haverstock Hill now sits.
