e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Over the years it has grown out of proportion to the rest of the garden and would be impossible to prune to a suitable size. It is unbalanced and has no branches or greenery on the north side of the tree. It is now leaning towards the house. - The acidic properties of the tree combined with the sticky sap that is exuded means a large portion of our garden is unusable. The plants which had attracted local wildlife have all died. We have noticed a reduction in the number of butterflies, insects and birds as the plants around the Maritime Pine have been unable to survive. - The size of the tree means other trees in the vicinity are now suffering. The tree will be replaced with a 9m (or larger) Fagus Sylvatica (Common Beech). It is native to the UK and will be a mature specimen with established foliage and excellent CO2 conversion qualities. It is shallow rooted thereby causing less damage to the surrounding structures. The areas around the tree will be replanted with plants that support the local wildlife. 6.
