e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

T1- Ceanothus tree- Lightly back from parking area, road and Silver Birch tree by up to 1.5 metres. Height to remain the same.

T2- Birch tree- Lightly back from Pittasporum by up to 1.5 m.

T3- Indian Bean tree- Lift crown by approximately one metre over parking spaces 3 and 4.

T4- Prunus species- Prune back from Laurel tree by approximately one metre.

T5- Crab Apple tree- Remove crossing branches and branches growing in to Indian Bean tree.

T6- Shrub outside numbers 8-13 (on left)- Lightly prune back from 1st floor window.

T7- Pittasporum to right of number 14- thin crown to let light in to 1st floor windows.

Between numbers 26 and corner-

T8-Portuguese Laurel with Lilac growing out of it- Reduce Laurel by approximately 1 metre on right hand side , reduce height by approximately one metre and cut back from Lilac tree whilst maintaining rounded natural shape.

T9- Pyrocanthus- Reduce to height of road sign.

T10- Ash tree (Culvet Street)- Remove dead and hanging branches.

T11- Ceanothus outside number 38-43 - Lightly cut back from 1st floor window and wall by approximately 60cm.

T12- Maple tree with extensive crown die back opposite number 5 Kingstown Road- Remove dead trunk growing towards the Albert Pub and other branches that are dead or have peeling bark.

Opposite number 50-

T13- Catoniasta- Very light lift of approximately 50cm over parking area.

T14- Portuguese Laurel up against wall- create 30cm clearance from wall.

T15- Pittasporum outside 27-34 (internal)- cut back from windows by approximately 50cm.

T16- Catoniasta- internal across from 8-13 corner bed- Lift to 2.5 metres from ground level and cut back from window by 0.5 of a metre.

T17-Pittasporum- Remove stem closest to windows.
