1 The proposed advertisement, by virtue of its size, design and location, even for a temporary period, would result in an unduly dominant and incongruous fixture in the streetscape, and introduce visual clutter, detrimental to the character and appearance of the wider streetscene and adjacent conservation areas, and would be harmful to the settings and special interest of the nearby listed buildings, contrary to policies D1, D2 and D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017.
