## **DECISION**

Town and Country Planning Act 1990

## **Advertisement Consent Granted**

Address:

43-47 Shelton Street and 15-17 Endell Street London WC2H 9HJ

Proposal: Installation of 2 externally illuminated projecting signs and 2 externally illuminated fascia signs.

Drawing Nos: 17.058 / 004; 17.058 / 033 Rev J; 17.058 001

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following conditions:

## Conditions and Reasons:

1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to
  - (a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military):
  - (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or aid to navigation by water or air; or
  - (c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country

Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

## Informatives:

The proposed dark grey fascia signs would replace those existing in the same siting and include external illumination which is characteristic of surrounding shopfronts. The existing shopfront enjoys three projecting signs and proposals would replace these with two smaller scale additions. The proposal would not significantly impact the appearance of the building nor character of the conservation area.

Plans were revised to amend the size of the fascia signs to better respect the architectural features of the host building and signage illumination was revised from internal to external.

The proposed advertisements would not result in impact to the amenity of neighbouring occupants and would not be harmful to pedestrian or vehicular safety.

The planning history of the site and surrounding area were taken into account. Special regard has been attached to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the conservation area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

The development is in general accordance with policies A1, D1, D2 and D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with relevant policies of the Draft London Plan 2017 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.
