Hello,

In response to your letter notifying me of proposed work to two trees in garden of 21 Buckland Cresc., my response is as follows.

I would be very glad to see the work done, especially the felling of the poplar which both threatens damage to my back wall, and takes much light from my garden.

I would not want it killed, however, as it stabilises the water table on my land, and when I bought my property this was emphasised by my surveyor.

BUT,

the last time the poplar was lopped, it was done at the wrong time of year because the owner had allowed the tree to overgrow and a huge limb had crashed off into my neighbour's garden (they have two young children [REDACTED] and the situation was obviously dangerous and required urgent remedy.

The poor tree surgeon was faced with a very difficult job in summer with the tree full of sap and in full leaf.

The result was a lot of damage to trees, shrubs and plants in my garden.

The tree surgeon kindly replaced some plants and shrubs.

A lilac has still not recovered.

I DO NOT WANT ANY DAMAGE to be caused in my garden, nor for any parts of the lopped/felled trees to land in or be removed through my garden.

If any damage should be caused, it must be restored and the restoration paid for by the owner of 21 Buckland Cres.
