Replant with one standard ash in same position. T1: Ash: Co dominant stem at 1.5m with included bark. Crown encroaching road to west. Reduce branch to west over road by 2.5m to reduce risk of failure and to clear high sided vehicles. T2: Ash: Large amounts of major dead wood throughout canopy. Inonotus fungal bracket at 6m on stem to north. Overextending branches to west, south. Reduce overextending branches by 2m to reduce risk of failure, remove stem with fungal bracket and remove major dead wood T7: Plum: Multi stemmed at base, large stem to east growing around fence with heavy lean into neighbouring property. Reduce stem to east by 3m to reduce risk of failure. T8: Common Hawthorn: Originally co dominant stem at base, recently lost one of these stems to west. Remaining stem leaning heavily to east with mounding at base. Fell due to condition and lean towards neighbouring property T9: Mountain Ash: Heavy lean to east and pushing fence over. Fell to prevent damage to fence. T12: Common Ash: Decay on main trunk to west at 2m. co-dominant stem at 5m with included bark. Decay on north stem at 8m. Lean to east towards neighbouring property. Small amounts of major and minor dead wood throughout canopy. Pollard to 8m due to lean and decay. T14: Swedish Whitebeam: Staining on trunk, heavy lean to east. co dominant stem at 1.5m with included bark. Crown encroaching lamp post to south east. Reduce stems encroaching lamp post by 2m. 6.
