2020/0182/T		26/01/2020 19:00:28	OBJ	<p>Dear Sir/Madam</p> <p>this is one of the oldest and most beautiful trees in the conservation area clearly visible from the street.</p> <p>The council has approved the removal of a slightly smaller tree at 30 Glenilla Rd next to it a few months ago (not carried out yet) partially because of the presence of this tree. The council last year also approved a very significant redevelopment project at 30 Glenilla Rd relying on the two trees that are now to be removed to protect our privacy. If this application is approved that approval (without further protections) should now be called into question.</p> <p>It would seem perverse (and illegal) to now allow this tree to be removed. The tree is very far away from the house at 16 Belsize Park Gardens so we believe significantly more evidence of damage (and causality) is needed to support this application.</p>
