The comments which I wish to make are directly related to the actual proposals made by the Honin all conscience ourable Society of Lincoln's Inn relating to the considerably increased external lighting of the Great Hall library extension advocacy rooms and estate offices and directly opposite, and in full sight of, my third floor flat whose largest rooms overlook the illumination. As such they are material considerations in connection therewith . They represent lighting pollution on such an increased scale as to be likely and/ or calculated to be, or to constitute, a plain risk to energy saving, and a plain environmental risk both to wild life (especially birds) and to the comfort and quiet enjoyment of their tenanted premises by residents and professional business tenants free from nuisance or annoyance or negligent misuse of premises retained by the applicant and from the possibility or threat of an increased service charge burdens.

The deliberate avoidance of delivering notices to me and other tenants of 8 to 10 Old Square despite requests from me on repeated occasions for such delivery predictably resulted in tenants not being made effectively and timeously aware of these considerable adverse changes until very late in the day ie a few days before the deadline date and bespoke and continue to bespeak an inappropriate unlandlordly attitude to any need for any concerned and properly conscientious consultation of its tenants by an institution that could be expected to be honourable in its conduct of its obligations.
