At the time of it design, great care was taken with the design of the new buildings and the cobbles were retained. In fact, to maintain the aesthetic of the street, Camden Council relaid all the cobbles in 2019 for which the residents are most grateful. Hence most of the residents want to retain the character of the street as it was when it was rebuilt. Although significant alterations have been made to the back of some of the buildings, though the frontages have remained in character.  The proposed changes in the application to the side roof elevation and the frontage of the garage would be insensitive to these design considerations and would considerably disrupt the carefully planned and maintained uniform design, and character of the mews. In principle, I would be more amenable to a significantly modified plan in which changes were only to be made to the rear elevation in a way that they would not be visible from the street level of Fairfax Place.
