| 2019/5705/P | Ellie Reddington | 16/02/2020 11:01:37 | OBJ | <p>Dear Mr Chan</p> <p>I am the owner of the raised ground floor flat which is immediately above the flat where the extension is proposed, and I am one of the lessees in the building (15 Thurlow Road , London NW3 5PL)</p> <p>I would like to register my objection to the current proposal for this extension for the following reasons: The size of the proposed extension is strikingly large and it is out of scale and proportion to the existing building The dimensions of the proposed extension had not taken any consideration or respect for the other flats in the building nor for the adjacent neighbours The height of the proposed roofline at its highest point almost reaches one of my window sills and if the extension is permitted to go ahead It would feel like a structure being immediately under my nose The height of the roofline at its lower part is still too close to my window sills and its proximity to my windows could be a security hazard and would also result in direct loss of privacy due to its closeness and height involved</p> <p>The length of the proposed extension looks like to be two-thirds of the length of the existing building and covers large section of the garden and green space and markedly diminishes the enjoyment of the green space and its view from my flat and other lessees in the building , but it is my flat that will bear the brunt of the loss of view and feel the negative impact the most</p> <p>My understanding of extensions was that they are supposed to be much smaller and proportionate in scale and they have to respect the size of the existing building, the immediate buildings (neighbours) specially if there are any existing neighbouring extensions and also to consider the buildings' characters in the street in general</p> <p>If this extension in its current form is approved, this would be a very bulky, unsightly and uncharacteristic addition to the building and the neighbourhood</p> |
