REAR GARDEN: 1 x London Plane (T1) - Fell to ground level.

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 15 January 2020 and decided to **OBJECT** for the following reasons:

Reasons for objection:

The s.211 notification is for the removal of large, mature London plane tree from the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Belsize Park Conservation Area. The notification has been submitted by a insurance company on behalf of a policy holder at a different address. The notification alleges that the tree is implicated in vegetation-related property damage.

This 22m tall mature plane tree is a dominant tree and is likely the largest in the immediate vicinity. Despite its rear garden position, the scale of the tree is such that is highly visible above buildings from the public realm. The tree is visible from Glenoch Road, Haverstock Hill and Glenilla Road, both from outside 28 Glenilla Road and also when looking north west along the rear gardens of Glenilla Road and Belsize Park Gardens.

The tree is part of a belt of trees along the rear gardens of Belsize Park Gardens

and Glenilla Road, which is considered to be a significant landscape feature.

The tree is considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of this part of the conservation area and to provide a high level of visual amenity to the public.

No level monitoring data has been submitted with the notification to demonstrate that the property damage is vegetation related.

The evidence submitted is not considered sufficient to demonstrate that the tree in question is contributing to the damage.

A tree preservation order has been served to protect the visual amenity the tree provides and the character of this part of the conservation area.

A Tree Preservation Order has been served on the tree/s and no work should be carried out without the prior consent of the Council.

- You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
