The Council has considered your application dated 29 January 2020 and decided to refuse consent for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The application is to fell an ash tree from the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Belsize Park Conservation Area. The application has been submitted by a third party due to alleged vegetation-related property damage at a neighbouring property.

The ash tree is maintained by crown reduction and is considered to contribute to the character of this part of the conservation area.

The level monitoring data is not considered to demonstrate that the movement is seasonal and therefore vegetation related.

No roots from the application tree (ash) have been found.

The evidence submitted is not considered to demonstrate that the ash tree is contributing to the property damage.

The application has been refused to protect the visual amenity the tree provides and the character of this part of the conservation area.
