INTRODUCTION

Phase one of the workshops is now completed, working with a total of 32 members of the community and 6 facilitators through one – one workshops.

HATO worked with groups who were suggested by Mike Chandler, Arts Development Manager from Camden Council (who HATO are in regular contact with to update him and ask for any advice needed) groups include, Thanet Youth and Community Centre, Pirates Castle's youth groups and also their elderly group (with members of Castlehaven community association joining that session) as well as a session led with community members at the Camden Local Archives in Holborn.

We are keen to develop more trips to the archives with members of the local community, to help research selected themes for phase two further. We are keen to work with Wac Arts and Pirates Club Youth Group for Phase two of the project.

SUMMARY

HATO have been working with Tudor Allen at the Local archives in Holborn in researching and developing narratives on their own and with local members of the community.

We took three elder members from the workshops with us to explore more themes together and share findings with the wider group.

An introduction to the archives was made by archivist, Tudor Allen and a tour of the exhibition. There is a great demand from participants to visit the archives again in early March, this time with 9 members of Thanet Youth and Community Centre. This has been a real success in terms of interest and understanding of the area and how it has changed and is ever being redeveloped and re-imagined.

Stories Around Food & Production


- Watching the canal and seeing boats with lots of orange's going to the marmalade factory

SUMMARY

The workshops with elder groups have been named 'Camden Collage Club', we invited participants to create collages made from the archive material we have sourced in relation to the themes we are searching. The workshop was accompanied by a presentation and group discussions about the history of the area and what key themes people were interested in researching further as well as local knowledge and sharing of stories.

WORKSHOP FINDINGS

Stories Around Food Import & Export

- Memories of key characters and people that would let children have treats of different foods
- Thinking about production and how things are made, changed, and distrusted
- Diversity of area meant there were many food to sample, taste from all over the world. Changed the way people ate, consumed and understood different ways of cooking and making food.

- History of ice coming to the area 'first taste of icecream' for Londoners, great chunks of ice coming down canal all the way from Norwegian Glaciers through canals it arrived in Camden and stored
- Farmland, what was here before? Ideas around production of food and where it comes to and from
- History of food markets on Inverness Street, idea of local, sharing recipes and food and tastings
- ABC Industrial Bakery mass production
- Memories of biscuits being damaged when being transported lots of broken biscuits which were given as treats to kids

Stories Around Railways and Canals and Tunnels

- Memories of goods coming in and out (including exotic woods used for pianos being made)
- Meeting new people

WORKSHOP YOUTH PIRATES

The workshops with young people explored the history of the local area through an interactive map making session with particular reference to the canal and the young people's perspective on it. A new handmade typeface was also created together using potatoes in response to the history of the farmland in the area.

The typeface will be digitised and used for upcoming projects as our own bespoke typeface, Prates Castle want to now use it for their own flyers etc which us a great output of the project and legacy.



Throughout the sessions all groups and participants have been really interested in the history of Camden Goods Yard and the fact that it represents and talks to/about the great industrial history of the area, acting a like a landmark in itself. The site of Morrisons and the new developments are like a living museum/archive.

There has been a lot of interest in how this history connects to other parts of the country through railways and canals, connectivity plays a key part for local people as well as the idea that Camden Goods Yard was described as an island, sitting between places this became a strong visual reference.

Another key interest has been food / farming history of the land and how food was coming in and out of the area.

Cheryl did recommend WAC as a group to work with due to the fact that they do not get as many opportunities as Roundhouse do for external partner project opportunities.
THE MUSIC WALK OF FAME, LEE BENNETT AND MARK WILLINGALE	KK and PB met with them to talk about their project and possible overlap in resource/research. There is a potential for the young people to perform their spoken word/poetry at public events through their own connection and productions in festivals/gigs. This is TBC
CAMDEN TOWN UNLIMITED	KK and PB met with Simon Pitkeathley, Chief Executive and his team to discuss the façade project and were given some more links and leads and possible overlaps and opportunities for expansive and reach of project.
CAMDEN LOCAL ARCHIVES	We have met with Tudor Allen and his team and introduced the project and will be collaborating with them. They are supporting us in assisting our research into various areas of research and archives material for workshops and have / are hosting visits with us for the 'research' groups of elders. We spent a day in the archives gathering material for our initial workshops and have taken a group to meet Tudor, have an introduction and delivered their own self directed research for their project.

PHASE TWO CO-DESIGN

Moving forward we now propose to work with young people from the Pirates Castle as the lead co-designers. The young people are local to the area and have limited access to visual arts projects in the public realm, they are from low economic backgrounds and this would be a great opportunity for them to work so closely with designers, artists and writers in such a project, gaining real experience and opportunity to work on a long term artwork in their neighbourhood.

They have a real interest and understanding of Camden Good Yard, the geographic links make it a great opportunity to build relationships longer term. The historic links between the Pirates Castle and Camden Goods Yard are of real interest, the canals, trains and vaults (which are underneath the Pirates Castle and we can have access to them) makes it truly unique and tells such a brilliant story.

The team there have been so supportive of the project and it links really nicely with the workshops with Over 50s group that we ran there. We would like to find a way to keep the voices of the elder community in to phase two after such a successful project as part of phase one. There is such a demand to continue with the research and connection to the archives that we feel its important to work with Thanet Community Centre, the participants from Castlehaven community association and The Pirates Castle.

We have also been in conversation with Chas Mollet, the Assistive Creative Technology Officer there and his team to talk about the potential of working with them on the spoken word / performance second phase of the project with their outreach members (18-26 year olds with learning difficulties). The only issue with this group is their time-frames and schedules and our deadlines.

Moving forward we would still love the opportunity to work with Roundhouse and their young people's programmes, we would like to make a proposal directly to them about the opportunity for their young members to have paid mentoring sessions, working with Young Pirates to produce stories and poems based on their findings and archival references.

We propose that this work takes place during the Easter Holidays in April 2020.
