

Description

The asymmetric design allows access to the service boxes whilst also partially screening them with planting.

It also creates a wider planting bed at the front which will provide more screening but also more interesting planting as there will be more light passing through the railings.

The planting will be contemporary. It will include grasses for texture and colour where the light allows. There will also be colour in the foliage providing all year interest.

Entrance tiled in black porcelain tiles to contrast with bricks

Path widens for ease of access

Extending hedge, new planting in front

Brick path, running bond pattern

Narrower path keeps it further from tree & allows more planting beside

Iron gate to match railings

Medium height planting can be viewed from inside but won't block the light

Evergreen planting partially screens service boxes

Straight joins in bricks more contemporary look (or could be mitred if preferred)

Shrubs to partially screen boundary

Tough planting in dry shade around tree. Planted in small pot sizes

More colourful plantings more light enters via railings

Railings on top of wall T&A on site
